²Admission to ETSU Teacher Education Requirements:

1. Formal application to College of Education Teacher Education Program.
2. Completion of 32 semester hours of General Education courses including 6 hrs. English 1010 & 1020, 8 hrs. Sciences, and 3 hrs. Mathematics.
3. Pass CS 101 (transfers to ETSU as CSCI 1100) or Proficiency Exam.
4. GPA of a least 2.50 on all General Education work as reflected in calculated GPA excluding Developmental Studies classes.
5. ACT composite score of a least 22 (E, R, M, & S only); or SAT combined scores of at least 1020 (V & M only); or Praxis scores of 174 in Reading, 173 in Math, and 173 in Writing.
6. Submission of portfolio as initiated in EDUC 2300.
7. Completion of successful interview with the College of Education Admission Board.
8. Demonstration of good moral character and freedom from any condition that would impair effectiveness as a teacher. Includes passing scores on an approved speech and hearing test and notarized statement of character.
9. Completion of ED 201 with a grade of "C" or better.

10. Complete a background check and receive clearance. (Must be initiated in 321 Warf-Pickel or will not be accepted; also must be completed four weeks before submitting application for admission to teacher education.

During the first semester at ETSU:

- Start file
- Complete approved Speech and Hearing screening
- Attend Portfolio Session through the Department of Curriculum and Instruction

By end of the second semester at ETSU:

- Pass UIT Proficiency Exam or CSCI 1100 (if not previously completed CS101 at CHATTANOOGA STATE)

Students are strongly encouraged to take CS101 while at CHATTANOOGA STATE as this course facilitates progression through teacher education at ETSU. Completion of this course or the UIT Proficiency Exam must occur no later than the end of the second semester at ETSU.

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Transfer students with 50 or more transferable hours are required to take half the intensives requirements two writing, one oral, and one using information technology. You must take these courses at ETSU as transfer credit does not satisfy the intensive requirements.
